WORKSHOP – NEW GUIDELINES FROM THE INTERNATIONAL LYMPHOMA RADIATION ONCOLOGY GROUP

Part 1: RADIOTHERAPY IN THE ELDERLY

Chair: M.K. Gospodarowicz, Toronto (Canada)

The growth in number of much older patients presents numerous challenges in management. It is appreciated that elderly patients have poor prognosis, multiple comorbidities, and since they are underrepresented in clinical trials, the evidence for best approach is lacking. Hence, the optimal treatment in older patients is not well defined, and there is an unmet need for improvement. This workshop will review the evidence and future prospects for improving outcome in older patients by incorporating radiation therapy in treatment regimens tailored to the needs of this growing patient population.

PART 2 – DOSE – FRACTIONATION ISSUES IN RADIOTHERAPY OF LYMPHOMAS

Chair: R. Hoppe, Stanford, CA (USA)

Recent randomized trials have demonstrated that lower radiation doses than were used in the past are adequate for lymphomas, enabling reductions of doses to normal tissues. The evidence will be reviewed and put into clinical perspective. The unique radiobiological characteristics of lymphomas have not been exploited, but changes in fractionation and treatment time could potentially lead to even better sparing of normal tissues without compromising local control.
